What to expect during and after the procedure for Long-Term Treatment

Your doctor can explain the minimally invasive procedure for starting long-term treatment with a small bladder control device called the **InterStim® System**. This device provides gentle electrical stimulation that helps to correct the miscommunication between the bladder and the brain to relieve your symptoms. The InterStim® System includes the device, a thin wire called a lead that carries the stimulation, and a wireless programmer.





Here are some key points about the procedure and treatment:

Convenient—The procedure is performed at an outpatient center or hospital.

Short—It takes about an hour, and you'll be able to go home the same day.

Minimally invasive—The device and lead are implanted. The device is placed in your upper buttock just under the skin.

Adjustable—You will be given a wireless controller to stop, start, and adjust your treatment. It's designed to be easy to use—your doctor or nurse can show you how.

Reversible—The device is not permanent. You and your doctor always have the option of turning it off or surgically removing it.

Common questions about

Medtronic Bladder Control Therapy

What can Medtronic Bladder Control Therapy do for me?

This long-term treatment significantly improves quality of life by reducing symptoms. It's proven to work in people suffering from frequent urges to urinate (urgency-frequency), frequent leaks (urinary incontinence), and the inability to fully empty their bladder (urinary retention).

How long does it work?

In studies, symptoms of overactive bladder and urinary retention* were significantly reduced in people treated for 5 years. Your experience may vary.

Is this treatment safe?

Medtronic Bladder Control Therapy involves a safe, FDA-approved procedure that doctors have been performing for more than 15 years. It is safe[†] for MRI head scans, a widely used test for diagnosing certain health issues.

Complications from long-term therapy may include pain at the implant site or new pain, infection or skin irritation, movement of the thin wire attached to the device, technical problems with the device, and interactions with certain other devices. These events are typically treatable. For more information, talk to your doctor or refer to the back cover of this brochure.

Important Safety Information

Sacral Neuromodulation for Bladder Control (Medtronic Bladder Control Therapy Delivered by the InterStim® System)

InterStim Therapy for Urinary Control treats urinary retention (inability to completely empty the bladder) and the symptoms of overactive bladder, including urinary urge incontinence (leakage) and significant symptoms of urgency-frequency. It should be used after you have tried other treatments such as medications and behavioral therapy and they have not worked, or you could not tolerate them.

You should have a successful trial assessment before receiving InterStim Therapy. You cannot have diathermy (deep heat treatment from electromagnetic energy) if you have an InterStim device.

InterStim Therapy is not intended for patients with a urinary blockage. Safety and effectiveness have not been established for pregnancy and delivery; patients under the age of 16; or for patients with neurological diseases such as multiple sclerosis.

In addition to risks related to surgery, complications can include pain at the implant sites, new pain, infection, lead (thin wire) movement/migration, device problems, interactions with certain other devices or diagnostic equipment such as MRI, undesirable changes in urinary or bowel function, and uncomfortable stimulation (sometimes described as a jolting or shocking feeling).
